

How are board members of the JCOP elected to the board? It all starts with a participation and showing an interest on doing things for the JCOP. It all starts with you talking to one of the board members and expressing your interest for being on the board. (Note: You do not have to be on the board to sponsor an event but this is for another article.)

The board consists of the President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Directors (voting), Associate Directors (non-voting). In addition there is the Chief Concours Judge, Newsletter Editor, and Webmaster.

The Jaguar Jargon has a current list of all directors with Phone #'s and e-mail every month.

Normally a member (did I forget to mention that you have to be a JCOP member) starts as an Associate Director:

- 1. so the other directors get to meet you and get to know you
- 2. We would like you to sponsor an event, your choice, one you would be comfortable in doing. (Maybe even taking over an event already in existence.)

A progression is normally established: Associate Director – Director (voting) – 2nd Vice-President – 1st Vice-President – President (Head Honcho, Boss man, big shot, lay the blame on, Hee, Hee).

The President is elected every year. The President holds his office only two years and then steps down in deference for the 1st Vice-President to be elected President with the 2nd Vice-President moving up to be elected 1st Vice-President.

The President appoints two board members and a non-board member as the nominating committee. They bring forth a slate of board members for the oncoming year. The slate is then elected in during a JCOP member meeting (usually a dinner meeting).

This year after the nominating committee puts forth a slate of officers it will then be published in the Jaguar Jargon for all the membership to see the JCOP Officers presented for the next year. There can be nominations previous to the election meeting and also from the floor the day of the meeting. The 2019 Sewickley Show in Review

Saturday August 10, 2019, Broad Street, Sewickley

Both spectators and the proud owners of a variety of impressive automobiles turned out for the Jaguar Club of Pittsburgh's "Annual Display of Exceptional Cars," held on a blocked off section of Broad Street between Beaver St. and Thorn St. in the picturesque town of Sewickley. It was the usual fabulous weather, comfy temperatures and sunshine all day. Participation was good, cars & members, as well an admiring public. We had forty-two cars registered for event, plus two new Jaguars, an I-Pace and an F-Pace that representatives from Bobby Rahal; Jaguar brought for us to get to look at up close. You may recall from various sources that I-Pace is Jaguar's electric vehicle, and has been garnering many repeated awards in the automotive field. It was good to be able to get a close look at both of these cars (many thanks to Bobby Rahal Jaguar). The variety of cars (in no particular order) included Jaguar, Maserati, Rolls Royce, Bentley, Aston Martin, BMW, Lincoln (1958), Pontiac (1960), Chevrolet Corvette (1960), MG, and GMC (1954). We also invited the Rolls Royce Club of Pittsburgh, and the local chapter of the Classic Car Club of America, to join us and help create as much diversity as possible via as many examples as possible of exceptional classic cars from over the years. The oldest example this year was a 1937 Bentley, but we also had cars from almost every decade from then through the present.

In addition to the Judged Classes and the "Display Only" category, we also had passersby participate in the "People's Choice Competition." People, from young children up thru seniors, enthusiastically became the "judges", and cast paper ballots for their "picks". A lot of ballots were printed and we used them all! We awarded four People's Choice winners: "Best of Show Overall" was won by Fred Segal's 1958 Lincoln Continental; "Best Sportscar" was won by Charlie Robert's 1968 Maserati Ghibli; "Best Rolls Royce/Bentley" was won by Scott Drab's 1987 Rolls Royce Corniche Convertible; and "Best Classic Car" was won by Terri Hohman's 1954 GMC Pickup Truck (which was a flawless and amazing restoration which she just acquired via the Mecum Auction). Then there was the winners in the thirteen judged classes, whose results are also listed herein. It was indeed a very exciting day, as Sewickley always is, with a lot to see, a lot to gab about, plus lots of smiles and successes. I've shared herein, some of the pictures from the show, but it's really worth it to see all of them. I took some of the pictures at that site, but my son –in-law Matt Snyder (many thanks!) took most of them. You can tell which are his, as they look like a pro took them.

Speaking of pictures, I recently found something hidden away in a box of goodies ... a panorama aerial picture from the 1985 edition of this show, when it was at it's prior venue at Station Square. Look closely ...



As a point of reference, this year is the 38th Annual edition of the Sewickley show, but bear in mind that it came to Sewickley in 1999, where its been up thru the present. But the show actually goes back much farther, originating in about 1980 (at Station Square, when it was called the "Station Square Show." Though still the same show, just in a different place). I go back pretty far with this show, and was very much

involved in the origination and evolution of the show way back then, and many years thereafter. In the 2000s to the present, three of us were involved: Bob Gelfand, Scott Drab, and myself.

When I was doing the show in 1985, the venue in the above picture was in the access street between the far end of the "Freight House Shops", and the nearby parking garage building. I took the picture from about the 5th floor of the stairway of the adjacent Freight House Shops building, looking down for a great aerial view ... and yes it was via the old way with film! Then I literally "cut and pasted" four pictures together with scotch tape back when "cut and paste" meant just that. No digital camera panorama options. Some of you who have been in the club for as long as myself may recognize some of the cars and surmise who some of the people are standing nearby might be. Let's see if you agree with my memory. Jess Mellor is standing just to the right of center, beside his silver 1970 E-Type Roadster and is wearing a "pith" helmet. Among the other cars I can identify, in the far row at the top, I see Bryan William's white E-Type roadster, Chuck Pipich's Fiat 850 Spyder is to the left of Bryan's E, and on its other side is Alva Chellman's silver blue E-Type coupe. Then there is Bill Cooper's brown TVR, John Miller's black E-Type with his silver blue Ferrari 250 convertible. Don Campbell's 1953 MG-TD is in the middle of the middle row and Dick bishop's white XK-140 is in the front row behind Jess Mellor's E-Type. Behind that is Chuck Kusiolek's Gold Corvette. I think Henry VerValen's XK-140 Coupe is hidden among people at the far left end near the edge. I am also sure that Rick Bartkowski must have a car in there, perhaps one of those E-Type V12 Coupes in the front row (maybe the green one in front of Jess Mellor's silver roadster?). I can pick out and identify about half the cars, maybe some of you readers might recognize some of the others that I can't recall for sure whose they might be. Your turn to be the detective.

This picture is such a piece of history. It has to be roughly the "5th edition" (though it wasn't being tracked by "5th Annual" just yet), and today we just finished the 38th edition. So vintage cars are not the only vintage things in Sewickley. The show itself is "vintage" also. All of you who come and show your car, plus those who help by providing things like logistics support, judging, and financial support, are ALL important parts of this show. It's great that this show's deep roots are being kept alive. Many things never change, and I am truly very grateful to all of you who come and contribute in all these ways, to maintain the tradition. By the way, one other thing is still the same as in all those years past ... the "Concours Lite" judging. The idea and purpose, was ALWAYS to have a bit of casual relief from the pressure of a formal Concours competition. It was always designed to "dial it down" a bit to encourage more participation, relaxation, and bring out more cars. Now in no way, am I suggesting that the formal Concours is bad, (it's not!), and I do endorse and encourage it. It's just that this show was always meant to offer a casual alternative, be a little easier, and maybe draw more cars out. That is still the show's mode today: "Concours Lite" as you see it billed.

There were many people who made this year's show possible with all their help and donations. A special thanks goes out to our sponsor, Bobby Rahal Jaguar, and especially our new contact person, Ryan Fuchs. We appreciate Rahal's generous financial support, the massive array of door prize, and bringing two a pair of the latest Jaguar models for us to see. One was a brand new Jaguar I-Pace (electric vehicle) and the other was Jaguar's F-Pace. I also wanted to extend thanks to all the hard-working judges who did a wonderful job and deserve a great deal of thanks for their dedication, knowledge and attention to the judging task. In no particular order, this year's judges were: Rick Bartkowski, Don Taskey, Scott Drab, Charlie Roberts, Fred Segal, Don Johnson, Chris Davis, Paul Grandy, Terri Hohmann, and Chief Judge Bryan Williams (Jim Boffo was out ill, but is ok). Thanks also to Amanda Lawson & Shirley Roberts, both who greatly helped in the committee tent with check-ins, etc. I also want to thank Scott Drab, Charlie Roberts, and Bob Scheall, my son-in-law Matt Snyder, for helping me with managing parking and gate control. I also wanted to thank Matt Snyder, for taking almost all of the pictures you see on the follow-on page and at the website link. Plus a special thanks to Charlie and Shirley Roberts for bringing and setting up the registration tent, tables, chairs, supporting food and drinks, especially the sandwich rings, and more. Thanks also to all of you, who brought your cars out ... that IS what it's all about! Finally, I also want to thank the Borough of Sewickley and Council for the use of the venue and providing municipal services on the day of the show. Without the effort, donations, and hard work of all these people, the show would not have been possible. Thanks also to Dolly Taskey, for her help in the archive and making it possible for us to see all the pictures online. I really

hope I didn't miss anyone! I look forward to seeing everyone and all the cars again in 2020! Make plans now for next year, as Saturday <u>August 9, 2020</u> is the tentative date. Enjoy the pictures below and on the next pages, and remember MANY MORE pics can be seen at the web link


