

Some Useful Tips When Placing an Ad in the Journal, JCNA's bi-monthly publication

When composing an advertisement for the Jaguar Journal, please keep in mind that there is a very strict size limitation on the text that can be published. I suggest that you review the most recent ads that have been published and select what appears to be the largest of those. Then, in a new Word document, type in the text of that ad exactly as it appears. Even better, adjust the margins so you have the same number of lines as the ad that appeared. Then in a new paragraph in the same document, create your advertisement making sure that your version is smaller than the one you have copied. The editor is extremely busy and does not have time to go back and forth with you to get it right, so you will have an easier time if you use this method.



As this is last month of my presidency, I again feature our longest standing JCOP member, Henry Ver Valen. His story continues from last month as he recounts his adventures in his beautiful Jaguar XK 120 M OTS. In his own words....

Before I knew it, I was driving through Manhattan in a brand new Jaguar OTS. What a thrill! I should say "reserved thrill" because I was not familiar with driving the Jaguar, let alone driving among a crowd of BIG cars, unsure of directions, and on a hot day (blessedly no overheating). I finally made it through the Lincoln Tunnel and headed south to Baltimore - open country/ highway driving, not much traffic in those days. What a thrill! There was nothing like the Jag on the road. The acceleration was immediately available at a slight nudge of the throttle pedal. The feeling you get when you were so close to the road that you are a part of it! The sound of the six-cylinder wonder, particularly with the "M" model (the two separate down pipes, each with a four bolt pattern flange to bolt to a "sports" muffler with two separate exit pipes. A sound of power music!



I successfully arrived in Baltimore and Dad approved, with the proper cabin ventilation. However, Sunday I had to drive back to my ship in RI., IN THE RAIN! The hood was up, side curtains installed so that the cabin actually stayed dry. The screen wipers rotated easily to the top of their stroke, but all heck would break loose as the blades reversed their direction and slammed down to the vowel to renew their upward wiping movement. I had no clue what to do except keep driving and worry about how long the wiper mechanism would stay together with that violent crashing. No choice but to press on. Well into the night, still raining, now following a large truck which suddenly decided to make a left turn (no signals). My Jaguar brakes behaved like we were driving on ice. But somehow I managed to swerve and skid to the right to avoid a disaster.

After that incident I always used a lot of caution and maintained distance behind the car in front when driving in the rain. I did board my ship on time. Later, I examined the wiper blade problem and discovered that on the return stroke the wiper blades rotated slightly just enough to snag the windscreen extension of the hood. When the wiper motor developed enough torque that the blades would pull free. I checked the worrisome brake problem and learned that the XK 120M model was fitted with hard competition brake shoe linings and had back plate air ventilation holes. So drive cautiously in the rain. After that, I sure did.

I found a general inside parking garage space in Newport for leaving my Jaguar while I was away at sea. This worked out for awhile. After an extended assignment away from Newport, I returned to the garage to pick up my Jaguar and noticed that the offset gear shift shaft was significantly rotated, indicating some hard gear shifting. Why? Then I learned there had been some sort of local driving/touring competition conducted in the area while I was away and surely, someone had competed with my Jaguar--best to move the Jaguar out of here! I did find an adequate two-car garage closer to my ship's landing location which was owned/rented by an elderly gentleman who fiddled with cars. Well, as it turned out "fiddling" with cars included quickie enamel spray jobs for very "thrifty" customers. All was well until I arrived one time to pick up my somewhat covered Jaguar and was devastated to find that the uncovered areas (fortunately I had fully covered the hood) were coated with a light blue hue like what my "elderly gentleman" was using on a nearby car. A missed moment! I immediately started working with a light solvent followed by compounding and waxing to clean the coating away. I continued to rent the space with the promise that my Jaguar would be completely covered during all painting operations. No problems after that understanding.


