

On January 31, I attended a Zoom meeting of the Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix’s Car Show Committee as a JCOP representative. The meeting was hosted by PVGP’s Bob Speers and Dan DelBianco with several other car clubs represented.



Dan said the immediate need was for volunteers to attend the Pittsburgh International Auto Show (Feb. 18-21). A signup roster is located on the PVGP website, pvgp.org. The annual charities check presentation will be made around 2:30 PM Saturday 2/19 at the show. Dan hinted that the 2021 donation will be substantial. It would be great if JCOP would be represented at this year’s Auto Show.

The 2022 “Marque of the Year” is Porsche. It would be good to learn what will be expected of Porsche so we will know what is expected of JCOP when Jaguar will be the 2026 Marque. Porsche always is well represented in a normal year, so I would assume they will have a great number of cars as this year’s Marque.

Bob Speer said that the number of cars displayed at the 2021 show was even more than 2019 show, the last pre-pandemic year. He attributed this to possibly pent up demand. He is hopeful of even a better turnout for this year. He said Bobby Rahal is not planning to have their tent for this year which will free up room for additional show cars. Rahal will sponsor PVGP’s Blacktie and Tailpipes Gala to be held this year at the Grand Concourse at Station Square.

PVGP’s Bernie Martin talked about publicity for the event. He said if there is a significant vehicle that will be attending, he would like to know. Also, if someone spent a significant time and effort to restore a car, this will be another potential news story. The JCOP members should think about what cars or members would be good candidates when it’s our turn again to be the Marque of the Year.

As members of JCOP are now well aware, the Coventry Foundation was formed some years ago to be the primary source for information and materials related to the heritage of Jaguar Cars in North America. It has been approved by the Internal Revenue Service as an approved Charitable Organization pursuant to Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Gary Kincel of JCOP is the Chairman of the Board of the Coventry Foundation.

In my role as JCOP Liaison to the Coventry Foundation, I have learned much about the Foundation, Jaguar motor cars, and the many wonderful people who have supported the Coventry Foundation with their time, talent, and treasure. I was able to learn about the Coventry Foundation from Gary Kincel (one of the founders of the foundation) through participation in his periodic Zoom meetings with Liaisons at Jaguar Clubs all throughout North America (Canada, the US, and Mexico) as well as by spending one-on-one time with Gary. Gary has always been generous with his time to educate me (and others) about so many things Jaguar. These Zoom meetings for the Coventry Foundation have allowed all of the Jaguar Club Liaisons to collectively get to know each other better and share information and during these sessions Gary and George Camp (President of the Coventry Foundation and co-founder with Gary) would educate all of us about the many aspects of the Coventry Foundation. When I attended the Jaguar Clubs of North America Annual General Meeting in August, 2021 in Columbia, SC I got to tour the Coventry Foundation headquarters location and literally- as I have shared in previous articles – the first-hand experience to be in the presence of all that has been collected was worth millions of words.

Previous editions of Coventry Corner have tried to convey to you, as the reader, the mission of the Coventry Foundation and how so many volunteers have done such a tremendous job in getting the foundation to where it is today along with the many wonderful donors to the foundation. So while I was not holding myself out as the expert's expert about the Coventry Foundation, I was pretty sure I knew what was going on and had assimilated all the information on the Coventry Foundation website. With Dolly Taskey having created a new, super website for JCOP, I was desirous of having the Coventry Foundation not only referenced on our website but having a link to the Coventry Foundation website on our JCOP website. In furtherance of this goal, Dolly and I recently spoke telephonically and the experience was most revealing to me. And in the possible event that what I learned might be equally eye-opening to some of you who read this column, I wish to share some takeaways about which Dolly educated me.

First, I learned from Dolly that there was an excellent twenty minute video about the Coventry Foundation narrated by Gary Kincel and, at the end, by George Camp. Filmed at the Coventry Foundation headquarters in Columbia, SC, the video (available on Vimeo) was produced most professionally. And rather than have you all search for it via Google – since it is not on the Coventry Foundation web site – Dolly agreed to put a link to it on our new and updated JCOP website, which is jaguarclubofpittsburgh.org .

I really commend you find 20 minutes to view the presentation. And if you don't know Gary Kincel already, you will be impressed and if you do know him, you will not be surprised as to the great job he did. I need to ask Gary why is this video not on the Coventry Foundation website but it is at least is on our website with Gary having given permission to Dolly to do so.

In the course of this discussion with Dolly, I learned that if Google knows our new website address, Google does not offer an option to go directly to our new website by using the Google "Search" function. The old website (jaguarclubofpittsburgh.com) is listed but that is *not* our current, new website but the old "Go Daddy" website. So don't be fooled by going there. What Google does offer is the ability to go to our new website by taking one to the JCNA website where JCNA then has JCOP listed at the top by our club number (NC 45) and in the right column is a link to the current website for JCOP. While Dolly is exploring what needs to be done with Google to get them to list our current website on its own when one does a "search" for jaguarclubofpittsburgh.org, the other way to get to our new website – and to do so directly - is for you to enter the jaguarclubofpittsburgh.org address directly in your browser and then click the arrow or whatever is on your screen to take you directly there.

So as the above discussion with Dolly led us to these various issues, and I was asking Dolly to put some things on our JCOP website such as a link for access to the Coventry Foundation website and the British Sports Car Hall of Fame website, Dolly asked me a question where I answered it truthfully and her reply to me took my breath away. Specifically, Dolly had engineered our new website so that if one put their cursor (from a mouse or moving one's finger on various laptop pads) on various photographs, pictures, text, images, and logos and upon doing this a "hand with the index finger pointing up" shows on your screen, that means that image, photo, text, or whatever is a link. Yes, a Clickable LINK even though it is not underlined text or a button on which to click. I had *no idea* the website already had these many links to so many places. For example, on the Home Page of our JCOP website Dolly had most artfully designed words that were vertical and horizontal in different fonts including Road Trips, Fall Leaf Tour, Tech Sessions, Dinner Meetings and many more. EACH of these words is a link in and of themselves that can be clicked upon to take you to see more detail about each of what the words describe in a calendar of events for 2022. Sure, I had seen the hand with the index finger pointing up before but, simply put, I never really understood that whenever one sees such a symbol when a cursor is hovering over anything on a screen, that is a clickable link. So while Dolly acceded to putting into writing specific underlined text to get the reader to click to take one to the Coventry Foundation website, one can also get there just as easily by clicking on the red Jaguar saloon pictured by the door to the Coventry Foundation that she has on our Home Page!

Dolly seemed amazed that I did not already know that almost anything can be used to be a link to further information if designed that way such that a cursor will show a hand with the index finger pointing upward. I told her I guess I sort of knew this but it was not intuitive to me to think she had

so many links already imbedded in her website design with photos or images that were also links. I told Dolly I had been so impressed with the website before I knew that links to other information need not be text that is underlined or colored but when I learned that our website had sooooo many links of which I previously had no idea, once I started exploring all of them on our website my amazement was only superseded by my overwhelming appreciation of how deftly and thoroughly Dolly had designed and crafted our website, not to mention that almost weekly there will be updates she makes as the year progresses and more and more events are planned and meetings are held, etc. Every one of you needs to go to our jaguarclubofpittsburgh.org website and start taking your cursor and hovering it over almost anything and when a hand shows, click on it and see what you get ! Start on the Home Page clicking on those words in different fonts that Dolly listed horizontally and vertically and you will find this design was done not to merely look like art but it is truly a work of art in function as well as form. Click on the links below on the Home Page involving the Coventry Foundation and Gary Kinzel/George Camp's video or the Facebook Discussion or Facebook Photo links of a traditional nature that allow you to see what was on Facebook without you having to go on Facebook. Click on the red saloon on the Home Page and you will get the idea how you can click on many, many things throughout our JCOP website to take you for more information and photos on various subjects. Try it and you will learn more about the Coventry Foundation just as I did. And then you will learn a lot more about our club and Jaguars by clicking on other text, images, photographs, logos, and buttons and more. Dolly told me I was not the first person to tell her that they did not appreciate how many links were imbedded in our website for which some of us had no idea but when we spoke and I was just so amazed at what I learned, she then realized what was easily intuitive to her was not necessarily so to others. So at the urging of some of us, she has now – seemingly to her disdain as an artist but at least giving us and her the satisfaction of having an instructional note on the Home Page – put such language in a box right below the photographs at the top of our Home Page.

So yes, your Liaison to the Coventry Foundation learned something he did not fully appreciate or know and is happy to admit it and share it with you in the hope that if any of you, like I, was unaware of how to determine whether anything is not only what it appears to be but could *also* be a link to take you somewhere else, then hopefully this will educate us all. This will help us not only with JCOP and our website but in experiencing a fuller appreciation of how links exist in many forms that are increasingly now apparent on electronic media that touches all of our lives involving many subjects. Yes, perhaps every third grader knows what I have shared but most of us did not grow up in an electronic media world and some of us benefit by such remedial learning experiences. We owe a debt of gratitude to Dolly Taskey that would be hard to ever fully pay but we can all start by enjoying her JCOP website to the fullest and then telling her how much we each learned by now knowing how to obtain the fullest immersion experience.

2022 JCNA ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING Milwaukee, Wisconsin MARCH 24-27, 2022 Host Club: Wisconsin Jaguars Ltd.

Friday, March 25 Friday afternoon will feature a short bus trip to Mike and Deb Korneli's garage, which houses mostly Jaguars, several with race history, and lots of auto and garage memorabilia. There also will be a special presentation by Brian Sheridan, who was Engine Program Manager for Tom Walkinshaw when Jaguar won Le Mans. Brian has an interesting story to relate; you will hear firsthand what really happened during those amazing years.

Friday evening will feature a dinner at the AGM's revised host hotel, the Sonesta Milwaukee West in Wauwatosa, with entertainment provided by a great musical group that can play everything from Sinatra to rock and everything in between. The fellowship, cocktails and music will begin at 6:00 p.m.

Saturday, March 26 Saturday's organized activities will begin with the AGM business meeting scheduled from 8 a.m. at 2 p.m. After the conclusion of the AGM business meeting, a short bus ride will take attendees to the Wisconsin Auto Museum in Hartford (in

photo at right), the city where the famed Kissel Car Company produced their well-regarded cars from 1902 to 1931. The Wisconsin Auto Museum is the state's biggest car museum and features the largest collection of Kissel vehicles anywhere. It also



houses many examples of other Wisconsin-built cars, such as Hudson, Nash and American Motors. The two-story museum has a large and eclectic collection of historic artifacts, including vintage outboard motors, the restored Soo Line 1003 2-8-2 steam locomotive built in 1913, a terrific model railroad, and much, much more. The Southeastern Wisconsin Short Track Hall of Fame occupies space in the facility to commemorate the history of regional racing in the area.

Next, it's a short ride to the historic Linden Inn on Big Cedar Lake for the Saturday evening banquet and awards presentation. The Linden Inn has been a popular place for vacationers and diners since 1908.

There are many other places to explore around Milwaukee but none is more popular than the HarleyDavidson Museum, one of the city's top tourist destinations.
