President's Perspective

Stu Benson and I were privileged to represent JCOP at the JCNA AGM (delayed from March to August this year due to Covid19) in Columbia, SC. I warned Stu on the drive down that some of these meetings in the past may have been considered by the FDA as a cure for insomnia, but this year there was actually interesting and meaningful discussion on a number of items. The full AGM package of 156 pages presented to the delegates is available on the JCNA website for your perusal if so inclined (now that may actually cure insomnia) but here's a summary of the major agenda items that generated recommendations to the JCNA Board for approval:

JCNA Bylaw Revisions & Corrections: Bylaws were updated to reflect CP C-0600-101 in the IRS code.

This states that JCNA and its member clubs must receive less than 35% of its income from non-member sources unrelated to the purpose of the club to maintain "non-profit" status. JCOP has no issue here since virtually all of our income from dues, event registrations and sponsor contributions are directly related to the purpose of the club.

JCNA Financial Status and Possible Dues Increase: The current income forecast projects depleted cash reserves in 2025. A \$10 annual dues increase in 2022 along with other cost reduction actions under investigation e.g. electronic distribution of the Jaguar Journal, etc., will enable JCNA to operate at break-even or better and maintain year-end reserve cash balances greater than one-year consolidated expenses by 2024 at current membership levels. Following considerable discussion, it was agreed that the increase was necessary. JCNA dues have not been increased since 2012 and at \$40/year would still be lower than comparable national car club dues. The AGM delegates voted to approve Board action to increase dues up to \$10/year. The Board subsequently approved \$40/year dues for JCNA effective for 2022.

Concours Rule Book: Perhaps not surprisingly this agenda item generated some animated discussion. 355 rules had changes but "only" the 65 with changes considered major were included in the package for review. The most significant change among those 65 is that any change to Concours rules approved at an AGM is now effective on January 1 of the following year instead of immediately following that AGM. This eliminates the possibility of entries in Concours held prior to the AGM in a given year being judged and scored differently from those participating in Concours following that AGM. This change along with all 355 others was approved by the delegates with the exception of the following three amendments:

Testing and certification of Concours judges will remain at three year intervals instead of the annual testing and certification proposed.

Continuation vehicles restored by JLR will not be included in Class S4. They will be judged in the same way as any restored example of the original model.

The requirement that no Concours can be scheduled within 12 days of an AGM or IJF has been eliminated. If a sanctioned Concours is scheduled and the AGM or IJF moves to that date, the Concours can proceed as originally scheduled.

Coventry Corner

As many members of JCOP are now well aware, the Coventry Foundation was formed some years ago to be the primary source for information and materials related to the heritage of Jaguar Cars in North America. It has been approved by the Internal Revenue Service as an approved Charitable Organization pursuant to Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Gary Kincel of JCOP is the Chairman of the Board of the Coventry Foundation.



Your Liaison (*in photo at left*) as well as JCOP President Dave Gamret now know a lot more about the Coventry Foundation as a result of spending a day “up and close” visiting the Coventry Foundation on Friday, August 27, 2021 along with other attendees to the Jaguar Clubs of North America Annual General Meeting in Columbia, South Carolina that weekend. Indeed, Dave and I got to attend an informal dinner at the British Bulldog Pub on the Thursday evening of our arrival in Columbia, SC which resulted in our getting to meet, in person, so many of the distinguished

members of the Board of Directors of the Coventry Foundation and enjoy a drink (or two or three) after our all-day drive to Columbia. Gary Kincel (Chairman of the Board of Directors) and George Camp (President of the Coventry Foundation) were wonderful hosts, introducing us to just about everyone. And to say that the Directors and supporters in attendance at this dinner were most enjoyable, knowledgeable, and personable folks would be an understatement.

Dave Gamret got to sit next to Mike Dale, the retired President of Jaguar North America who is simply a most amazing, genteel, and accomplished man. While we can talk about Mike’s many accomplishments in his career with Jaguar and as a sports car racer and most accomplished pilot of many types of aircraft (in 2001 he was awarded a CBE by Queen Elizabeth for his services to British Industry; he served as an RAF Fighter pilot during his stint in the military) at another time in this column, on Thursday August 27 Mike and Dave enjoyed a lengthy discussion regarding the period of Jaguar ownership by Ford Motor Company and then the divestment of Jaguar by Ford. They both clearly enjoyed their in-depth talk, with Dave then working at Ford and Mike and Dave knowing many of the same people but having somewhat different perspectives based on their personal knowledge.

Mike's lovely wife Mary accompanied him and she was impressive in her own right.

Accompanying this article are but a few of the many photographs your liaison and Dave took on Friday, August 28. The sign on the door (see photograph of the same) included the statement: "Please no backpacks or bags and no flowing garments.". This was not because the Coventry Foundation was concerned about theft but, rather, that space was tight with all the items on display and in storage such that there simply was not a lot of room to move around and no one wanted any accident to occur by a backpack or bag knocking something over or damaging artwork or such. Volunteers kept the visitors moving so everyone had a chance to see everything they wanted and then others could be let into the spaces.



While we all have known about the "tool loan program" that is free to any JCNA member to obtain any Jaguar factory or dealer tool for their use (or the use by any mechanic working on their vehicle) free of cost (other than the cost of shipping), the tools do not come from JCNA but come from the Coventry Foundation which has amassed more Jaguar tools going back in time than perhaps any other single location in the world. Appreciating the size of the space that is needed to store and display and access these tools brings a new appreciation to what the Coventry Foundation has accomplished, as you can see from photographs accompanying this article. Indeed, the Coventry Foundation has not only "hard" tools but has started collecting the electronic equipment necessary for diagnosis and service of Jaguars built in the last 25 to 30 years. We were told that some Jaguar dealers no longer have a lot of this equipment since they are not prepared to service such older vehicles both because of needing older equipment they no longer possess that is in operating order but also because their technicians were not trained in the use of such older equipment. Indeed, some delegates to the JCNA AGM shared stories of their local dealers no longer being willing to service Jaguars more than 10 years old! So the Coventry Foundation is providing an invaluable service in obtaining such electronic equipment, whether by donation or by purchase, before it no longer exists.

The library area has a wealth of Jaguar service manuals as well as sales and other literature and artwork. It contains a plethora of printed materials that one could spend days or weeks reviewing.

Two of the rooms at the Coventry Foundation contain collections of model Jaguars and as can be seen in accompanying photographs of some of these collections, they are extensive and simply amazing.

The Garage area is, in and of itself, a place where folks saw a gorgeous vintage Jaguar, tools, and parts of all types and where one could spend a long time if they were so interested and inclined to figure out what was there. We saw Jaguar vehicles now owned by the Coventry Foundation that have been donated to them; they only have space to store some of them at the Foundation location at this time.



There were many “takeaways” from our day at the Coventry Foundation. While future “Coventry Corner” articles will delve into these, it was clear that the Coventry Foundation holds a unique place in the world with regard to their not merely collecting so many things Jaguar and putting them on display, but instead making the Coventry Foundation a resource that is accessible to Jaguar owners where volunteers can help locate information or documents or tools needed, where George Camp can –and does, free of charge - provide advice many times each day to Jaguar owners throughout the world about how to repair or service their car or what is original or not, and where having a Jaguar and belonging to a Jaguar Club that is an affiliate of Jaguar Clubs of North America provides entrance to all of this, and more. The Coventry Foundation, as now visualized by JCNA delegates from around the United States at the AGM (unfortunately, the Canadian and Mexican clubs could not send representatives to this AGM because of restrictions on travel into the US by their governments), is “the real deal” and needs more space. Indeed, the plan is for them to raise enough money to have their own building instead of renting the site where they presently are located on St. Andrews Road in Columbia, SC.

All of this demonstrated how worthwhile the value is of donating money, Jaguar vehicles, Jaguar documents, Jaguar tools and equipment and anything else “Jaguar” to the Coventry Foundation. What they have accomplished in the past six years is simply breathtaking. Our visit fully ratified the support JCOP has provided the Coventry Foundation over the years, financially and otherwise, and demonstrated why all of the JCOP members need to spread the word far and wide why the Coventry Foundation needs to continue to be supported to an even increased extent by those who love Jaguars and want Jaguar history to be preserved and are in a position to do so.
