Remembering Norman Dewis


Jaguar fans world-wide lost a great ambassador of the marque last month, Mr. Norman Dewis. Many JCOP members were first introduced to Norman when we hosted JCNA's 2008 Annual General Meeting. At one of the meetings we discussed the possibility of inviting him to the AGM and weighing the costs and benefits. It was the best decision that the committee made.

It was decided that professional writer, newspaper journalist and JCOP member Candy Williams would conduct an interview at a seminar with our guest. Not knowing how or if this would work, we arranged for a small group to have dinner with him the evening of the day he arrived in Pittsburgh. Within 5 minutes of meeting Norman, I knew that the seminar would be a great success.

The day of the seminar, the large meeting room of the Pittsburgh Sheraton Station Square hotel was filled with row after row of chairs. A table with two chairs and two microphones faced the empty room. The eager fans arrived early to get a seat close to the speaker. Before the starting time, it was standing room only. Gary Kincel explained the format and introduced the participants. The prepared questions gave the audience the opportunity to hear firsthand how Norman drove the E-Type, 77 RW, from Coventry through the night to Geneva to meet the demand for a test drive in the new Jaguar sports car. He talked about his development work on the one off XJ13 and his crash in the car after one of the wheels failed. Scott Drab led off the question-and-answer portion of the seminar. Scott had read the "Norman Dewis of Jaguar: Developing the Legend," a lengthy book by Paul Skilleter, within a few days to be prepared for the seminar.

The audience gave Norman a round of applause at the end of the talk that seemed to end way too soon. A long line formed in front of the interview table to obtain an autograph of the Dewis book which was sold at the seminar and a photo opportunity. Books were not the only things that were signed; others included Don Johnson's E-Type operating manual, George Keller's vintage leather race helmet and Dick Bishop even had the firewall of his XK140 signed. Norman was available throughout the weekend and truly enjoyed talking with and answering questions from the AGM participants.

Meeting with Mr. Dewis was by far the high point of the AGM. He gave everyone great memories and he will be missed.

4. In 1935, the SS Jaguar name first appeared on a 2.5-litre saloon and sports models of which were the SS 90 and SS 100.




The name changed from Swallow Sidecar Company to Jaguar Cars Ltd, in 1945.

We will again have an exciting grouping, that will represent a breathtaking array of interesting cars ... Jaguars! ... Rolls Royces! ... Bentleys! ... and great Classics! Cars are parked with generous space in between, sufficient for everyone to get a close look of each, while “shoot-the-breeze” talking about all the thing that car junkies among us love to share! Plus there are plenty of appreciative passersby and trophies to be awarded. Also, we are very appreciative for the regular annual support from Bobby Rahal Jaguar, who has renewed their sponsorship for yet another year. They will also be displaying a two new Jaguars and will be providing an impressive array of door prizes, just as they have typically done for each of many years now.

Register now - it surely will be another great event not be missed. As in past years, participants can choose to be in either of two categories, “Display Only” (not judged), or the “Judged” category. Though judging is not mandatory, it is conducted in a very casual fashion that is best described as “Concours-lite”. It does NOT involve the demanding detail of a formal Concours, but has just enough to still be relaxed and simple. Due to the limited size of the venue, we are limited to 50 cars.

WHEN: Saturday, August 10th, 2019 rain or shine.

TIME: Check in 10:00 AM - 11:00 AM at the registration table.

Final cleaning 10:00 AM – 12:30 PM. Judging begins at 12:30 PM. Awards 3:00 PM

SHOWING OPTIONS:

Category #1 -- Non-Judged. (Display only)

Category #2 -- Judging & eligible for a trophy according to categories based on registration. Classes will be mixed marques, generally grouped according “decades” (i.e, cars of the 20’s, 30’s, 40’s, 50’s, 60’s, 70’s, etc), with adjustments as necessary for unique cases. The usual informal judging format (not a formal Concours) will be used, and a maximum of three trophies will be awarded in each class.

Emphasis is on appearance, cleanliness, and fundamental originality (specifically, originality will be basic and informal, and NOT with excruciating detail).

PEOPLE’S CHOICE AWARDS: Three trophies (Jaguar, Rolls/ Bentley, and Other Classic) with the most votes will be awarded according to votes cast by the admiring public. Any registered entry is eligible to win, provided it has not won a 1st place People’s Choice award in the last 2 years of this show. Both judged and display-only entries are eligible.

REGISTRATION: Registration fees are as noted below. All registrations must be received by August 9, 2019. Provided space is available, registration will be \$10 more on the day of the show. Please REGISTER EARLY, it helps us determine classes in advance. Judged Category is ONLY available to advanced registration. Day of show entries can only be in the non-judged “display only” category. Registration is complete once your check & application are received in the mail, or via email scan of this form. Your registration materials etc. will be distributed the morning of the show, upon your arrival.


Remembering Norman Dewis
