









Each month I feature a JCOP member and the history of their Jaguar. I wish to showcase cars that I find very impressive and interesting. This month's feature is about Chuck Pipich's 1966 E-type and 1999 XK8.

In 1977 Chuck Pipich bought his first Jaguar, and like many who see a beautiful Jaguar, say to themselves, 'I've got to get one of those someday.' That day happened to Chuck in 1973 when he saw an E-Type emerging from a side-street in Shadyside, Pittsburgh. One look and he was smitten, but it wasn't until a few years later before the actual Jag arrived. Chuck had owned several other cars and learned to do all the mechanical repairs, maintenance, and restoration techniques himself. His background in mechanical engineering helped a lot and this ultimately led him to decide that he

could manage an E-Type. So in 1977, Chuck found his 1966 E-type roadster. It had about 56,000 miles on it. Perhaps zeal blinded him somewhat into thinking that its actual fair condition was going to need "some work" meaning "total restoration".

Chuck bought the 1966 E-type from a private seller in Maryland, drove it home, with his wife Ellen following. She always knew where he was by the cloud that followed him. Soon afterwards, Chuck embarked on a total restoration of this E-Type, everything from paint, welding steel, all the mechanicals, and including an engine rebuild. He restored every part on the car with deep love every step of the way. After a few years, he had it on the road in time to show it at the 1986 PVGP when Jaguar was for the first time the featured marque. **The color is now carmine red, as shown above with Chuck's son, Rob, as they waited to begin the parade laps.**

In 1989 Chuck bought a 1977 red XJS from a seller in Washington DC area, who had shown it in various JCNA Concours. Chuck enjoyed driving the XJS, but in March of 2008, he traded the XJS for the champagne silver 1999 XK8 Convertible that he still has to this day. Chuck replaced and upgraded the timing chain tensioners and restored the engine room for Concours showing. He says the XK8 bears a number of similarities to the E-Type, but behaves very much like a modern car benefiting from many dramatic quality improvements made under Ford.

Presently, Chuck has the 1966 E-Type and the 1999 XK8, the latter of which gets seen a lot. It begs the question as to where is the E-Type now, since it hasn't been seen at shows for years. Chuck says it suffers from lack of use which began when some fuel system problems

developed. It also needs to be repainted since the red acrylic lacquer paint is now cracking away. It will need to be re-bored for oversize pistons to correct some bad engine clearance advice that Chuck received. Now with more experience over the years, Chuck should find it easy enough to have it road ready. He enjoys restoring the car and the Jaguar is his favorite hobby.

Chuck has been an active member of JCOP since 1977 and is presently on the Board of Directors. He is chairman of the Sewickley Show which started in 1981 at Station Square as the "Annual Display of Jaguars". Chuck has been president of the club and had been editor of the Jaguar Jargon newsletter for 13 years. In 1986 Chuck was chairman of the JCOP committee to help select Jaguar as the featured marque for the 3rd year of the PVGP. The event within PVGP was called "Jagfest '86", and was the first time that Chuck's 1966 E-Type was presented after his restoration effort.

Chuck and his wife Ellen have two children, Robert and Jan. They have three grandchildren and a son-in-law Matt. Chuck and Ellen have made numerous trips with club members to Watkins Glen for the vintage races over the past several years. *All stories are adapted from information written by each car owners.*

The 2018 Sewickley Show in Review “A Display of Exceptional Automobiles” Saturday August 11, 2018, Broad Street, Sewickley



Both spectators and the proud owners of a variety of impressive automobiles turned out for the Jaguar Club of Pittsburgh's "Annual Display of Exceptional Cars", held on a blocked off section of the upper end of Broad Street, in the picturesque town of Sewickley. 2018 marked a very unusual day for this year's Sewickley Show. For years upon years, there was never a serious threat of bad weather.. actually for as long as most us can remember. This year seems to have been the wettest August on record. The day before the show was pretty wet, and all of us wondered if Saturday would pan out ok. Yup we had some fog in the AM when it was time to leave, and the online weather looked encouraging ... but we didn't realize how much we would LUCK OUT ! There was some blue in the sky as the cars started coming in, and I would have never guessed I found myself needing a small squirt of sun block on the arms, as I started to feel the sting of sunburn. Everyone was just delighted, and the turn out was great, and the cars kept coming in, and the team kept parkin' em. We enjoyed one of the best shows ever both in terms of weather, and a lot of nice cars.

We had 47 cars registered for event, with about 39 actually showing up. A good year on turnout, and we actually came close to filling the site. We did lose about 8 spaces because of some storefront construction, but it wasn't a problem. There was lots of help parking cars, good gate control, and a club table setup with a canopy that everyone appreciated. A few things were a bit different this year, Cortile cars were not available (best wishes to Bernie Martin, one of our Cortile contacts, who has some sudden health challenges; we wish him well). The RROC (Rolls Royce Owners Club) was invited as a guest club, plus new for this year the CCCA (Classic Car Club of America) was also invited. They both sent a nice share of terrific cars, and very varied at that ... always something interesting and different to see! Of the total cars that showed up, about half was from these two groups, and the other half was a very nice turnout of club Jaguars. There was a special bonus offered to anyone who registered and brought a Jaguar. The details were kept a surprise until the morning of the show, but it was stated in the newsletter to be a classic item, that cannot be bought, and will never be made again. The bonus was the choice of a classic dash plaque, from a prior "Station Square", or "Sewickley" shows. Quite a few were available, in about 5 or 6 different styles/ years, some as from as far back as 1990. Since there was quite a number of different choices available, I approached every Jaguar owner at the show, in an order according to the postmark on their registration envelope, and asked them to pick their choice from the cache of classic plaques. Everyone was most appreciative, and it worked out well. And by the way, there is going to be a "Round 2" to offer the remaining plaques to the membership. See the notice for this elsewhere in this newsletter on what to do. Every member in good standing IS eligible, whether or not they were at Sewickley this year. The Sportbrake feature gives you a choice of driving modes, "standard" (i.e., the "tame" setting), or "dynamic" (sport) mode. The reviewers were amazed at how big the difference there was between them, especially with how the handling and suspension settings were transformed, and that they never switched out of sport mode. Just a few side bar comments to think about.

As always, the hard-working judges did a wonderful job and deserve a great deal of thanks for their dedication, knowledge and attention to judging detail. In no particular order, this year's judges were: Bryan Williams, Dan Hermann, Rick Bartkowski, Bill Cooper, Dan Meyers, Don Taskey, Scott Drab, Wayne Long, Dave Murray, Charlie Roberts, Paul Grandy and Chief Judge Jim Boffo. 

- 1. Change your oil and oil filter.** Changing your oil and oil filter at the intervals recommended in your vehicle's owner's manual is one of the best ways to keep the engine running trouble free. Neglecting to replace engine oil can result in poor engine performance.
- 2. Check your fluids.** When you change your oil and oil filter, you should also check your fluids. Check your power steering, brake, transmission and windshield washer fluids, as well as your coolant. If the levels are low, top them off and flush/replace them as recommended in your owner's manual.
- 3. Replace your wiper blades.** If they're torn or cracked, your wiper blades won't do much good in the middle of unrelenting spring showers, when visibility is reduced.
- 4. Check your charging system.** Cold temperatures can do a number on your battery, so now is a good time to have it tested. You should also check to make sure that your battery is securely mounted and that the connections are clean, tight, and corrosion free.
- 5. Fix your windshield.** In cities where sand and rocks are used on icy roads, motorists often end up with chips and cracks in their windshields. Any damage to your windshield can decrease the overall effectiveness of airbags, seatbelts, roof stability, and your personal safety in the event of an accident.
- 6. Check your lighting.** Check all exterior and interior lighting to identify any problems.
- 7. Lubricate your chassis parts.** Many newer cars are "lubed-for-life," but some still require regular chassis lubrication, so check your owner's manual.
- 8. Check your belts and hoses.** Cold temperatures can harden and/or damage rubber, so it's important to check your belts and hoses for damage. If you have to replace one of your belts, you may also have to replace the tensioner and pulleys to keep the new belt from slipping.
- 9. Check your filters.** Your car has a number of filters that are important to its longevity and should be replaced regularly. Check your engine air filter, your cabin air filter, and your fuel filter for damage or clogging and replace them if necessary.
- 10. Check your tires.** Check the pressure of all your tires (including the spare) monthly and maintain the optimal pressure recommended in your owner's manual. Check the tread for uneven or irregular wear and for cuts or bruises on the sidewalls. Rotate your tires every 10,000 miles and replace them if they are worn or damaged.

Last of the Sewickley Bonus "Classic" Dash Plaques to be Given Out in a 2nd Round




As stated in the Sewickley Show report, you can still get one of the bonus dash plaques from the cache that was leftover after this year's Sewickley show. It does not matter whether or not you even came to the Sewickley Show and got to pick from the cache. Either way, you can get one (or another one), in the 2nd round. Chuck

Pipich still has some of the classic plaques left from the 1994 and 1999 shows, but only 2 are left from 2003. For reference, the first show in Sewickley was 1999, and 1994 is from back when Station Square was the previous venue. There are four styles pictured. These will be given away to members as follows, but be prompt as some quantities are very small.

If you are interested in one of these plaques, and a member in good standing, please let me (Chuck Pipich) know via email sent to the email address noted below. It will be first come, first serve, in order of email time stamp in my inbox. Chuck will try to get them to you via events, club meetings, or by mail if necessary. These are the last of the classic plaques, and when gone, that's it. BTW, these plaques are all silk screened, an older process that is generally not used anymore. They are leftovers from the past era, and "never to be made again".

Three of the four styles are made from polished solid brass plate, the custom of the day. However, there is a slight exception that happened in 1999, when they were made in both solid brass and brass plated aluminum. They do look almost identical, except for the feel of the weight. They were done in different batches, due to a vendor error. The aluminum version of 1999 has very slightly crisper black line outlines on the white cars, compared to the solid brass ones, but the difference is barely noticeable. If you look very close at the two pics below, technically you can see the difference when side by side, but it is minimal. (Just telling all I know) ... or choose the brass, which is also quite nice to hold. So if you are choosing a 1999, be sure to indicate your metal choice, mention "1999-Brass" (note only 7 available), or "1999-Aluminum" (which as I said is actually brass plated aluminum). Lastly and very important ... please INDICATE A 2ND CHOICE, especially if your first choice is the 2003.

Britsburgh Festival: It's Pittsburgh with a British twist


Robert Charlesworth already knew after last year's Britsburgh Festival what the theme would be for this year's celebration of Pittsburgh's connections to Great Britain.

With the 100th anniversary of the end of World War I (1914-18) on Nov. 11 this year, he said it "felt right" to honor the contributions and sacrifices former Pittsburghers made in the name of freedom.

"We wouldn't be in the same place today if not for those who went to war," says Charlesworth, chairman of Britsburgh.

The 4th annual Britsburgh Festival from Sept. 4-9 organized by British-American Connections Pittsburgh will include 14 fun activities with a British twist, including four events that incorporate WWI themes and will help raise money for veterans' charities.

"All WWI events will collect donations towards our Britsburgh WWI Centennial Appeal for Veterans," he says.

The main event at this year's celebration will be an Exclusive World War I Centennial Charity Dinner from 6:30-9:30 p.m. Sept. 6 at Hartwood Acres Mansion in Indiana Township, the former estate of John and Mary Flinn Lawrence.

Charlesworth says the \$250-per-person event featuring "a sumptuous meal in an Edwardian style — a meal fit for King George V" is a perfect setting with connections to the war, as John Lawrence served as a pilot in WWI. Proceeds will benefit the veterans' appeal.

The dinner will be held in Hartwood's Great Hall, with themed decorations centered on the Flanders Field poppy, a symbol of remembrance.

Richard Turner, a regional director of Britain's Department for International Trade based at the British Embassy in Washington, D.C., will be the keynote speaker. Additional speakers will include WWI historian and author Elizabeth Williams and Duquesne University WWI historian Kimberly Szczypinski, who will talk about women's and Pittsburgh's important roles in the war.

The festival also will include two high teas, on Sept. 4 at Mansions on Fifth and Sept. 5 at the Omni William Penn, featuring a "Women in WWI" theme.

Leaning Cask Brewing Co. in Springdale will transform its pub into a British pub during WWI from 5-10 p.m. Sept. 8. Festivities include tapping of a new beer by owner Josh Lipke, a Burton Ale that recreates a classic style of beer served during the war. British TV comedies will be shown on the brewery's big screen, including BBC's "Blackadder Goes Forth," set during WWI.

Charlesworth says Britain's Queen Elizabeth is aware of their plans to pay tribute to those who served in World War I at the Britsburgh Festival. "I wrote to Her Majesty last year after the festival and told her we were going to do the World War I theme this year," he said. He received a letter back from a staff member at Buckingham Palace, saying "Her Majesty has asked me to convey to everyone involved in Britsburgh her good wishes for a successful and enjoyable event."
