President's Perspective

Now that the summer weather is providing the opportunity to finally start enjoying our cars at events with our fellow enthusiasts, it's time to get those Jaguars on the road and meet with friends again. We were invited to participate in a tour of the Hahn restoration facilities by the Rolls-Royce club; the Bentley club is hosting a show over Labor Day weekend (**See Page 14 for event update**), and the Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix came back to life with a full schedule of activities, including British Car Day organized by our mates in the Triumph club. So let's plan to support the upcoming events scheduled by our own club as we get up to speed for the balance of 2021. We kick off our festivities with Jaguars at Jacksons this month, host a JCNA sanctioned Concours in September, revive the highly anticipated Topgolf outing in October (**See details on pages 11-12**), perhaps take our annual Fall Leaf Tour, and then celebrate 50 years of the JCOP at the LeMont in December. Maybe, just maybe, attending any or all of these gatherings and sharing good times with Jaguar friends will finally make life seem normal again.

We hope you can participate in all of these events but let me take a minute and talk about the Concours. At last count, there were around 176 Jaguars in our registry of 110 members. Yes, many are projects that are awaiting the loving attention of their owners to put them back on the road. But I have to believe that the majority of our members' cars are running and driving examples of the marque. Which means that if we each have the resolve to participate in any one of the three classes, together we all can easily create a field of stunning vehicles at the Concours. We have 53 E-types in our club. This year is the 60th anniversary of that iconic design statement. Let's make a special effort to bring as many of those glorious works of art as we can to enhance our entry list.

I know many of you are reluctant to show a car because it's not "perfect" or has a few issues. I can understand that you may not want to have the car judged. But judging is a great way to learn how to improve your Jaguar by getting tips from the various experts we have scrutinizing the vehicles. Every year I enter my E-type in the Championship Class with no hope of scoring 100 points or being competitive on the national level. But each year I learn a little more about my car and focus on doing at least one thing to improve it for the following year. No pressure. No grief. Just another fun way to enjoy owning a Jaguar and making it just that little bit better. I heartily encourage you to give it a try.

Don't want to hear that you have the wrong left-hand framis bearing on your knuten valve? Then just vacuum, wash and wax your car for the Driven class. The judges won't be counting the blades on your fan, deducting for that oil leak around your cam cover or noticing the smudge on your boot carpet. They'll just be congratulating you on how great the car looks. But if six coats of hand-rubbed Brazilian carnuba is still not your idea of a good time, then just show up and park in the Display class. It's still a Jaguar and it will add to the overall ambience of the day. Bryan Williams and his crew have been working diligently to cover all the tasks required for this gathering to be an enjoyable experience for all the participants, regardless of which class is entered.

Coventry Corner

As many members of JCOP are now well aware, the Coventry Foundation was formed some years ago to be the primary source for information and materials related to the heritage of Jaguar Cars in North America. It has been approved by the Internal Revenue Service as an approved Charitable Organization pursuant to Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Gary Kinzel of JCOP is the Chairman of the Board of the Coventry Foundation.

With the Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix having just wrapped up an exciting two weeks of non-stop activities, all of which are relevant to vintage automobiles and vintage car racing, one could not help but see the overwhelming number of British cars that were present not only from around the Tri-State area but were brought from around the entire United States to participate in this one-of-a-kind event, including the only vintage race in the United States run on every day, public streets. One of the holdings of The Coventry Foundation is that they own and operate the British Sports Car Hall of Fame in Petersburg, VA. And on the very same weekend as the Schenley Park PVGP races (July 24 & 25, 2021), the British Sports Car Hall of Fame was inducting more honorees at the Kastner Cup, which was held in Portland, OR this year in conjunction with the Portland Vintage Car Race events.

The HOF honorees this year were Joe Huffaker, Sr. and Kjell Qvale.

- Joe Huffaker, Sr. has had an amazing career. As an SCCA press release shared when Joe was inducted into the SCCA HOF in 2017, Joe was a most successful racecar constructors. In 1954, he was contracted to build an Austin-Healey Special. The car, known as the Huffaker-Healey, was a common site in the late 1950s on race tracks in Northern California. In 1959, Huffaker joined British Motor Cars in San Francisco to open a competition department. Known as BMC Competition Department, this effort spawned a very successful string of cars including the BMC Formula Juniors and Genie Sports Racers. During this era, BMC Competition Department became one of the largest racecar manufacturers in the United States. From 1964 to 1966, Huffaker's attention was turned toward Indianapolis 500 competition. He helped build the famous MG Liquid

Suspension Specials, for which he received an engineering award for design and development. Huffaker also helped develop safety technology in the form of the deformable fuel cell. Not forsaking SCCA racing, BMC Competition continued to build dominate production racecars such as MGBs and Jaguar XKEs. But in 1967, Huffaker left BMC and formed Huffaker Engineering where preparation of winning cars continued. These included SCCA championship winning MG Midgets, MGBs, Triumphs and Jensen-Healeys. In the 1980s, Huffaker Engineering built Pontiac cars for the Trans Am and IMSA series. Joe is now 94 years old.

- Kjell Qvale, inducted posthumously, was a Norwegian-American business executive about which much could be written. Qvale was one of the key figures in the creation of the Jensen-Healey. Qvale became the first distributor for Jaguar on the Pacific West Coast. Qvale was one of the founders of the San Francisco Auto Show and the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance.

The Master of Ceremonies for the above induction was Joe Alexander, who is the co-founder of the Kastner Cup Race along with Kas Kastner, and he was also the grand marshal at the Vintage races held this weekend of the HOF induction in Portland, Oregon. Joe is a HOF member and a member of the Board of Directors of The Coventry Foundation. The Kastner Cup involves an annual vintage Triumph sports car race held at various racetracks around the country and is named after Kas Kastner, a famous Championship Race Car Driver and Race Team Manager whose efforts included focus on the Triumph marque in racing. Kas just passed away a few months ago in April but the famed Dolan racing family here in Pittsburgh has Triumph GT6 race cars from both Kas (as well as his rival Bob Tullius, another car racing icon and founder of the famed Group 44 Racing Team) that live on and are actively racing (including at the PVGP) and many of us here in Pittsburgh got to meet Kas when the Kastner Cup was here a couple years ago at Pitt Race.

The Kastner Cup is coming to Pittsburgh again in 2022 in association with the PVGP. And to make the circle even more complete, Kevin Kastner is the Director of Marketing & Sales at Moss Motors, Ltd from whom many in the JCOP purchase parts for their Jaguars and it is at the Moss Motors facility in Petersburg, VA where the British Sports Car Hall of Fame is located.

The photo at right shows a display case at the British Sports Car Hall of Fame with an assortment of material from Kas Kastner.



So not only are so many Jaguar aficionados also fans of other British Sports car marques, but it behooves everyone to better appreciate the advancements in British Sports car development and technology that came from racing and benefitted all marques including Jaguar, whose own racing program is legendary.

In future articles, we can hopefully share more information about the many Hall of Fame members of the British Sports Car Hall of Fame as well as those who comprise the selection committee. Many of these HOF'ers were involved with Jaguars at some point in their careers.

Your Liaison is looking forward to experiencing The Coventry Foundation location in Columbia, SC when he attends the JCNA Annual General Meeting in August. So stay tuned for an in-person, hands-on report in the next Jargon. Or as the then-famous song from The Happenings from 1966 was titled, "See You in September".


